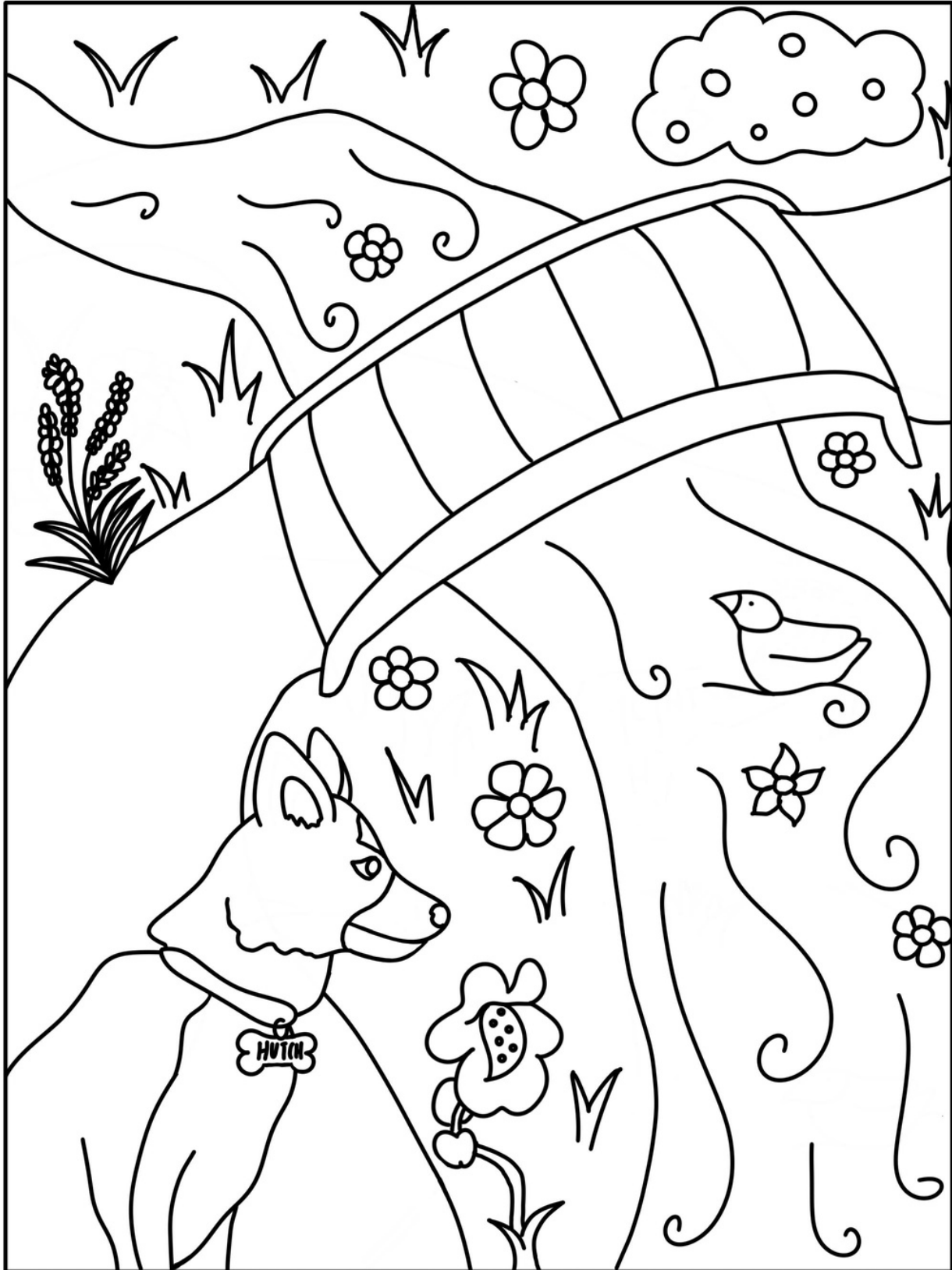

McIntyre Creek/Chasàn Chùà is very close to downtown Whitehorse. It has many forests and wetlands. Animals like moose, coyotes, lynx, bats, and bears use it to travel through Whitehorse without having to come into the city centre!

Featured Species

From yummy high and low bush cranberries to poisonous death camas, this area is a plant lover's paradise. A rare plant called the seep monkey-flower can be found blooming in July along some of the year-round freshwater springs.

First Nations Culture and History

The McIntyre Creek/Chasàn Chùà area is located in the traditional territories of the Ta'an Kwäch'än Council and Kwanlin Dün First Nation. Chasàn Chùà is the Southern Tutchone name for the area. It means "Copper Creek," since First Nations people would find copper nuggets there.
